



The Town of Geneva Municipal Court meets two times a month during the evenings to hear trials and one Saturday a month for initial appearances.

Wisconsin has a demerit point system whereupon the accumulation of 12 points in any consecutive 12-month period will result in the suspension of driving privileges in Wisconsin for two to six months

Wisconsin does not have court supervision

You have a right to be represented by an attorney at your own expense.

Any bond posted by credit card will be billed immediately and is not held until your conviction date.

Generally, the amount indicated on the citation will be assessed as your penalty if convicted. The court has the right to reduce or increase the penalty as determined by previous convictions, and mitigating or aggravating circumstances.

Upon failure to pay your forfeiture you may be required to serve up to 1 day in Walworth County Jail for every \$50 unpaid.
